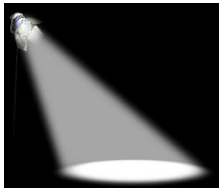

NEW MONTHLY RESIDENT SPOTLIGHT!!!



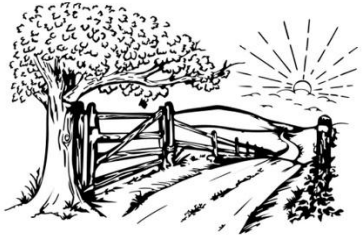
